**THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF LABOR STANDARDS
REQUIRE THE FOLLOWING TRAINING FOR ALL DEPARTMENTS:**



**OCCUPATIONAL EXPOSURE TO BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS
STANDARD - 29CFR1910.1030**

OSHA has issued a standard to limit occupational exposure to blood and other potentially infectious materials. The standard mandates engineering controls, work practices and personal protection equipment that, coupled with employee training, will reduce on-the-job risks. It should be noted that while Illinois is not an OSHA state, local government falls under the jurisdiction of IDOL who has adopted the OSHA standard in full. **HAZARDOUS MATERIALS
29CFR1910.120**

OSHA has issued a standard to limit occupational exposure to hazardous materials. The standard mandates work practices and employee training. Basic Awareness training is mandated for any officer that could be first on the scene of a hazardous materials incident. Hazardous materials training is provided by our academies in the Basic Recruit course. The Board offers through its MTUs both the full course and a refresher course. Both courses assist officers in meeting the required standard and remaining in compliance with this standard.
